We have planned that those of our prep crew who have not yet received any training will be able to attend a supplemental class on child abuse prevention during preps and we would encourage everyone to look into some of the resources that are available for recognizing and preventing child abuse as well. One option is the Stewards for Children program that the prep crew will be trained in. As Doyle communicated previously, an account has been set up and paid for so that any of our friends in Oregon and South Idaho can access that training.

As guests, our behavior should be appropriate, safe, and respectful. Happy children enjoying being together with their friends is an appreciated hallmark of convention. With this in mind, we would encourage parents to visit with their children about safe behavior while at convention. This would include being careful about playing unattended in isolated or dangerous areas like the hiking trails, the pond, and the old sawmill, making excursions along the highway to the convenience store, in addition to other considerations. Also, there are times when it is necessary to use the restroom during a meeting. A good practice would be for the younger children to be accompanied by someone responsible and for older children to make the time out of the meeting as brief as possible. This year, people will be patrolling the buildings and property both during meetings and at night to watch for anything that is out of place. We encourage everyone to be mindful of each other, both for our physical and spiritual safety.
